



#### Real Bedford beat FC Clacton 4-1 to advance to the next round of the FA Cup.

After a well-battled draw in the first game, there was tension in the air as the FA Cup tie had to be decided at the home of The Pirates. The game didn't disappoint and got off to a frantic start, with both sides pushing for the first goal in an end-to-end opening 20 minutes.

Both sides had chances to show their attacking prowess, but Bedford came closest to opening the scoring at the 10-minute mark. After finding space down the left, Mo Ahmed put in a low cross for Joey Evans, which he narrowly missed with his outstretched leg, but the ball fell to an onrushing Claston Gordon at the back post, whose first-time shot was saved by the right foot of Luke Avenell.

It wasn't long before FC Clacton were posing their own threat, and a well-worked corner gave Mekhi McKenzie a header towards goal; however, in contrast to the reverse fixture, he couldn't find the back of the net.

Moments later, Bedford found themselves on the counterattack, with Ahmed fouled on the edge of the area, giving Charlie Smith a chance to line up a free kick in a dangerous position. Which he converted in style, opening the scoring to the delight of the McMullen Park faithful.

After the goal, Bedford took control of the game without creating another clearcut chance, so both teams headed into the break with all to play for.

#### Second Half

Mo Ahmed was forced off with a minor injury at the break, which saw the introduction of Ben Stevens, who made an immediate impact. A strong run from Joey Evans saw his shot blocked by Michael Okafor, but Stevens was on hand to bury the rebound into the back of the net with a clever finish off the inside of the post, doubling Bedford's lead.

With a clear lead, Bedford retook control of the game, but the next goal fell to FC Clacton against the run of play. Good interplay between Charlie Collis and b C n si

McKenzie in the Clacton attack gave Jack Marshall a chance to get a shot on target, which was initially parried by McGregor but only as far as an opportunistic Teddy Collis, who smashed the ball into a vacant net to half the deficit between the two sides.

The goal gave Clacton a new dose of energy, with the team firing out from the restart and pressuring the Bedford players for the ball. The atmosphere changed, and it felt like Clacton may have the opportunity to equalise, but two minutes later, the home side restored their two-goal lead. With good pressing work up the field, Evans intercepted a Clacton pass before threading a pass through to Josh Setchell, who placed a composed finish under the keeper's legs in a similar fashion to his equaliser in the reverse fixture.


Moving into the last ten minutes of the game, Clacton then looked for their own response. Another corner proved tricky for The Pirates, as Oli Lamb's header forced an excellent save from Tyler McGregor in The Pirate's goal.

Soon after, Real put the game to bed with a second goal for Setchell. A perfectly weighted through ball from Lee Watkins found Jordan Brown on the flank, who drilled the ball back in-field towards an awaiting Josh Setchell, who in turn smashed the ball past Avenell in goal for his brace and Bedford's 4th of the evening and earning him the man of the match champagne.

The victory means that The Pirates will be back in action this weekend to face MK Irish in the next round of the Emirates FA Cup at McMullen Park. Tickets are available in advance on the website.

This week we sat down with Charlie Smith. The midfield maestro joined Real Bedford over the summer and has become an immediate fan favourite with a wondrous left foot and control of the game.

#### How have you found the start to this season?

It's been a positive start. With a new bunch of lads, the beginning of the season is all about trying to gel, and I definitely feel like we're getting there. Rob's style of play is very technical and requires a high level of skill which, for me, is an exciting challenge. We're only going to improve from here, and the result against Clacton on Tuesday has given us some great momentum.

## On Tuesday, you bagged your first competitive goal for the club in some fashion. What did that feel like?

It was nice to get on the score sheet. The crowd on Tuesday was rocking, so it was a great feeling to score in front of them. I don't usually get that many goals considering the position I play on the field, so I never take those moments for granted!

You are one of two new signings to start

# every game this season. How pleased are you with the consistency of football you're getting?

I'm very pleased. When I joined, Rob spoke to me about the sort of role he wanted me to play in the squad throughout the season, and so far, I've been loving it. We have so many technically gifted players, especially in attack, so it's enjoyable pinging passes to them and watching them do their stuff. I now feel like I have the team and the gaffer's trust, which I respect, and I hope to continue on this path throughout the campaign.

# Pirates fans have been raving about your free kicks online. How much do you practice your skill from a dead ball?

It's not something I practice too often at all. It has just been something that has come relatively naturally to me since I was quite young. I used to spend time on it after training at Luton Town, perfecting specific techniques, but now I just trust my instinct. I managed to score five last season, and I have already managed two so far in a Real Bedford shirt, so I'm happy with how that's been going so far.

You've spoken openly on social media about your dealings with mental health in profes-



# sional sports. What experiences have you found most challenging throughout your career?

I've been open about it, as I think it's an essential part of the game. I was at Luton from an early age and was lucky enough to be handed a professional contract. Unfortunately, a year later, I wasn't given another, which left me stranded. It felt like jumping off a bit of a cliff into the non-league world, which was a scary prospect. It's only over the past few years that I've come to terms with that situation.

But I'm certainly not alone. There are lots of like-minded people in and around non-league football who have struggled with the same sort of predicaments. You throw your life into football throughout your teenage years; otherwise, you won't get a contract, and that all comes back to bite you when you're released fairly suddenly with usually no real backup plan. I became an electrician for a bit, then decided I needed to get some qualifications, so I went to the University of Bedfordshire and have now come out with a degree whilst also being able to still play the sport I love, so I'm grateful for that.

# How important is it for players to continue talking about these matters, especially in non-league football?

It's being supported and spoken about within the world of professional football a lot more now, which is great, but not so much lower down in the football pyramid. It's a topic that I hope players continue to talk about because, as I mentioned, a lot are in the same boat.

## What's the ethos of the club like? Are you really enjoying your time at Real Bedford on and off the field?

Rob, as a player, coach and person, is very mindful of the culture and ethos he instils in us. The bottom line is that we work hard for each other on the field and celebrate that off it. It's a positive culture with many great personalities, making Bedford very special.

#### What are you expecting from our visitors MK Irish tonight?







On June 1st 2020 the club was formed when Milton Keynes Robins, Unite MK and Milton Keynes Irish Veterans joined together to operate as one club going into the 2020-21 season, Milton Keynes Irish FC!

Our first season as a club was unfortunately brought to an early finish due to the effects of COV-ID-19. The 2020/21 season was looking to be very promising as we found the first team sitting second in the SSMFL Division 1 table

after 9 games played with the best PPG in the league and went on an exciting run in the FA Vase which saw us get knocked out in the 3rd round on penalties after advancing through 4 rounds beating three higher league opposition. The season was officially curtailed, however due to performances under Milton Keynes Robins, the club earned promotion to the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division (Step 5) based on PPG over the previous 2 seasons.



The first team are back now playing at Step 5 in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division, after one season in the United Counties Premier League South in 2022-23 finishing in 5th position, the reserve team were playing in the UCL Reserve Division also finished in 5th position in 2022-23 and have moved over to SSMFL Division 2 for the 2023-24 season.

The Veterans are playing in the Milton Keynes Veterans League Division One, were triple champions

in the 2022-23 season and have been unbeaten in the league for the past 4 seasons.

2021 saw the addition of a Southern Counties U18 Floodlit Midweek team and also had youth teams coming over to join under the MK Irish banner from Scot FC, in 2023-24 the club has 7 youth teams spanning from U9 to U18 in the Milton Keynes & District Development League.


