




training, so I want to thank everyone at the gym who coached the squad through what was a gruelling conditioning circuit, taking many players out of their comfort zone.

The Pirates overcame an Aylesbury fightback to extend their lead at the top of the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division by 2 points.

The away side came out the blocks well determined to inflict a home defeat and created the first clear-cut chance of the afternoon. Fabian Garcia threaded a ball through to Jake Baldwin, which Lewis Burgess blocked but only as far as Garci. With only the goalkeeper to beat, he stabbed his shot towards goal, but McGregor got down well to trap the ball.

It would take another 30 minutes before Bedford got their first real chance at goal after a low-block Aylesbury defence nullified relentless attacking pressure. However, The Pirates broke the seal just before the break. Patient build-up play by The Pirates allowed Josh Setchell to cross. The ball deflected off an Aylesbury defender, only for Drew Richardson to head it back into the path of Setchell, and the winger threaded the ball through to Lee Wat-

kins, who fired the ball across goal, with Richardson providing a delicate touch at the front post to help it on towards Tom Hitchcock. The striker then buried his chance on the turn to open the scoring at McMullen Park.

Moments later, Bedford was in again. Superb one-touch interplay between Corbit, Setchell and Richardson found Ben Stevens in space. The attacker pulled it back to Setchell in the box, who buried it in the bottom corner to double The Pirates' lead inside 2 minutes.

Aylesbury refused to go down without a fight and pulled themselves back into the game on the stroke of halftime. After a corner from the away side came to nothing, Abu Khan's chance was blocked by Joe Steele, but the ball fell to Martin Lancaster on the edge of the area, who fired it home straight past McGregor at some pace to half the deficit heading into the break.



Second Half

Continuing their momentum at the end of the first half, Aylesbury Vale struck early in the second period. Quick thinking on the counter from Tom Cove set Jake Baldwin down the left flank. His cross into the area found an unmarked Abu Khan, who chipped the ball over McGregor to level proceedings.

The Pirates needed something special to retain the lead, and it came from young-ster Harry Hurst. He picked up the ball in a crowded area on the edge of the box and managed to curl a shot past Aylesbury defenders, dipping down in front of Charlie Jones' goal, glancing off the bar and into the back of the net. It was a fine way to score your first goal in Real Bedford colours, as the home side found themselves back in front.

It was then that Aylesbury started to tire, and Bedford turned the screw. Eddie Corbit picked up on a loose ball midfield and fired it towards Hitchcock. The striker flicked it in behind to Ben Stevens, who coolly converted his one-on-one chance against Jones to add to his recent goal tally.

Hitchcock bagged his brace with 10 minutes to go. Josh Setchell raced down the right flank before releasing a hard low cross, which Jones palmed into the path of the awaiting Hitchcock, who smashed the ball into the back of the vacant net.

With moments to go, Setchell nearly made it six but for a great save and the bar. Cutting in from the right, the winger unleashed a vicious shot, which Jones tipped onto the underside of the bar.

Welcome to McMullen Park. I am so grateful for your incredible support, which has really helped the club with its goals of bringing league football to Bedford.

My work covering Bitcoin and macroeconomics requires me to cover global politics, and something significant happened this week: Argentina elected a new President, Javier Milei. Milei is not just any ordinary leader. Renowned for his unapologetically libertarian ideas, he has managed to capture the public's attention nationally and internationally. Milei's rise to power can be attributed to his fearless opposition to conventional economic policies, advocating for radical and transformative changes within Argentina's complex economic landscape.

Milei's election comes at a pivotal time for Argentina. The nation has grappled with severe inflation for decades. This economic malaise has eroded the purchasing power of the average Argentine, leading to widespread discontent. Milei's campaign centred on tackling this issue head-on with policies inspired by Austrian economics. Contrary to the more widely adopted Keynesian model, this school of thought emphasises limited government intervention, free-market capitalism, and a strong focus on individual liberties in economic activities.

I explored these economic themes in depth during my recent visit to Argentina for my documentary series "Follow the Money," available on YouTube. Inflation, a topic I frequently discuss in these programme notes, is not merely an economic phenomenon but a hidden tax on the electorate, often punishing the poorest in society the most. It results from imprudent fiscal policies, often characterised by excessive government spending and money printing, which dilute the currency's value and erode society's fabric.

Javier Milei's presidency marks a groundbreaking shift in Argentina's governance approach. His presidency is expected to bring several fundamental changes:

- 1. Reduction in Government Size and Influence: Milei's plan involves significantly scaling back the role and size of the government in Argentina's economy. This reduction implies a move towards privatisation of state-owned enterprises, deregulating various sectors, and trimming down bureaucratic processes. The idea behind this is to enhance efficiency, foster entrepreneurial spirit, and reduce government spending, which is often seen as a source of inefficiency and corruption. Milei aims to create a more dynamic and self-regulating market environment by minimising government intervention in the economy.
- 2. Dissolution of Argentina's Central Bank: One of Milei's most controversial proposals is the dissolution of the Central Bank of Argentina. The central bank, typically responsible for controlling the nation's money supply and interest rates, is seen by Austrian economists as a source of economic instability due to its role in managing monetary policy. By elimi-



nating the central bank, Milei aims to prevent arbitrary manipulation of the money supply, which he believes is a major cause of inflation. This move would represent a fundamental shift in Argentina's monetary policy framework to establish a more stable and predictable economic environment.

3.Transition to Dollarization:

Milei proposes to replace the Argentine peso with the US dollar as the official currency, a process known as dollarization. This strategy has been previously implemented in countries like Ecuador and El Salvador. Dollarization can lead to immediate benefits like enhanced monetary stability, as it ties Argentina's economy to the more stable and globally accepted US dollar, potentially reducing inflation rates and restoring confidence among investors. It can also simplify trade and financial transactions with other dollarised economies and those using the US dollar as the trade currency.

Dollarisation is not without its drawbacks. It implies a significant loss of monetary policy autonomy, as Argentina would no longer be able to print its own currency or set its own interest rates independently. This reliance on the US monetary policy means that any economic turbulence in the United States could directly impact Argentina. Furthermore, the initial transition to a dollarised system can be complex and require significant economic adjustments. Milei's presidency, with these radical economic reforms, is set to test the viability of Austrian economic theories in a modern economy. The

success or failure of this experiment could have far-reaching implications, not only for Argentina but also for the global economic community, as it observes the impact of these unconventional policies.

Furthermore, Milei is a strong proponent of Bitcoin. He may propose legislation that would position Argentina as a leader in Bitcoin adoption, drawing parallels with El Salvador's pioneering stance. As a scarce, decentralised digital asset, Bitcoin presents an alternative to traditional sovereign currencies, which are susceptible to debasement through inflationary monetary policies.

The transition to Milei's proposed economic framework may not be smooth, particularly in the short term. The poorer segments of society might face hardships as the nation adjusts to reduced or the removal of energy subsidies and social welfare programs. However, the long-term outlook is promising, with the potential for more stable economic conditions and increased prosperity.



Step 3 side Billericay proved too strong for The Pirates on the day, as Real Bedford Ladies recorded their first loss this season.

Despite a 5-0 scoreline, the hosts battled hard and created many chances across the 90 minutes while being pushed on by a healthy crowd at McMullen Park.

The first goal came in the first few minutes of the game. Maddie Biggs burst through the defence, and while she appeared to be offside, the linesman failed to raise his flag. Goalkeeper Sarah Hudson rushed out to close the angle and blocked Biggs' effort, but she knocked the rebound square to Ruby Sealey, who tapped it into a vacant net.

Despite the early blow, Bedford

stayed strong. Some good footballing interplay between Erin Price, Chloe Martin and eventually Amber Smith saw the latter deliver a great cross towards Tash Fensome; however, Billericay's Hope Smith smothered the ball before the striker could get a touch.

Ruby Sealey would have her second inside 10 minutes up the other end of the field. Amber Gaylor delivered a pinpoint diagonal ball to Sealey, who trapped it down and slotted it past Hudson for her brace.

Bedford were equal in the game for the rest of the second half and put much pressure on the Billericay defence. Tasha Fensome and Cesca Partridge had chances to shoot on target throughout the remainder of the first half, but both were



collected comfortably by Hope Smith in goal. Gemma Croucher also gained a decent chance, but her efforts were just wide of the net.

Second Half

Despite the scoreline, Bedford entered the second half positively, knowing a goal would see them right back in the contest. Gemma Croucher drew a foul early on, allowing Carroll to whip in an inviting cross over to Fensome, whose header was inches from the target.

However, Billericay soon hit back with a third goal despite the pressure from The Pirates. Captain Lucy Jones, playing a perfect ball into the area off a corner, found the head of Amber Gaylor, who nodded it past Hudson to take Billericay clear with 20 minutes to go.

Tash Fensome was inches away from getting to the end of a good Chloe Martin delivery down the other end of the field moments later. But Billericay was proving too strong defensively to break down as Real searched for a late consolation goal.

However, it would be Billericay who would put themselves on the scoresheet again. Maddie Biggs curled a decent effort from just outside the area past Hudson for Billericay's fourth. With the clock in the red, Amber Gaylor bagged her brace from 30 yards out with an optimistic effort, firing past Hudson with many Real Bedford Ladies players further up the pitch in search of a goal.



This week, we sat down with Drew Richardson. Having signed for the club a fortnight ago, Richardson has already picked up a MOTM accolade on his home debut, impressing many Pirates fans. We talked to him about his time at the club, his decision to join The Pirates and where he thinks he impacts the game most on the field.

Looking back at last Saturday, your home debut. How did you find playing at McMullen Park in front of a strong crowd?

It was a good experience; a home debut is always exciting coming into a new club, and a crowd like that makes things even better. Aylesbury came with a clear gameplan, and to be fair to them, they were hard to break down. After letting that 2 goal lead slip, most teams would start to show cracks, but the character in this team and the talent to win shone

through. Overall, it was a good match for us against challenging opposition.

You seemed to have settled in well at the club; what's life been like for you on and off the pitch at Real Bedford?

It's been unbelievable; it's arguably the most welcoming club I've joined. Everyone seems to get along from staff, coaches and players, and there's a real buzz around the place, which is quite infectious. I go home from training, excited about the next session or game. It's a friendly environment, and I feel well-gelled within the squad. I did know a few of the boys before I joined, but the ones I didn't know have been awesome, too. The standards of coaching and training are a massive bonus, too, some of the best I've seen at this level.

What convinced you to make the midseason move to The Pirates?



The travelling to Corby Town was a bit too much for me. I'm a Bedford boy, so I wanted to get back playing in and around my hometown. Seeing the visions that the club and Pete had set out, I knew I would always fancy playing at the club; as a young player, it's exciting to see a local team with that ambition. Matched with the fact I knew the coaching staff well and was excited by the football they play, it ended up being the perfect match.

You have been known to play in multiple positions; where do you see yourself thriving most on the field?

It's a conversation I've recently had with Rob. I certainly enjoy playing in different parts of the field as it helps my overall understanding of the game, but I feel like I affect the game the most in the midfield. Having played with the gaffer before, I think

he can see that. But I want to do my best for the team and'll put in 100% wherever I am on the pitch.

What do you think this team can achieve this year?

I don't want to jinx it, of course, but I don't think there's any reason we can't push to win this league and to be honest, I think we could give it a good run in Step 4, too. I know from our squad and the age most players are at this team will only get better. So it's a delight to be a part of it towards the start of an exciting journey.

What are you expecting from Baldock Town, our visitors today?

Every team will come here wanting to beat us, but if we continue to focus on our way of playing and stay patient, we can strike when the time comes and hopefully get a good result this afternoon.

Following the demise of the original Baldock Town FC in 2001 the new Baldock Town were formed from the Baldock Town Youth FC as an outlet for youth squads in 2003. The new Baldock Town played its first competitive match in September 2003 in the North Herts' League at 'The Shed' on Clothall Road, Baldock. The match was against Magnum with a Rob Foster hat-trick sealing a 5-1 win. The club then progressed from the North Herts League to the Herts Senior County League (HSCL). The 1st Team won Div 1 of the HSCL in their debut season in 2007/2008.

For three seasons from 2008 the team played its home matches at the County Ground, Letchworth but they returned to Baldock to play at their old ground in Norton Road now known as the North

Herts Arena.

After three near misses the 1st Team finally won the HSCL Premier Div title in 2012. Unfortunately due to ground grading issues the team were unable to take their place in the Spartan South Midlands League (SSML).

In order to achieve its ambition of playing at the highest possible level the Team were forced to move to ground share with Hitchin FC. The club finished in second place the following season but this proved to be good enough to secure that elusive promotion to the SSML. The side, managed by former player Scott Grant, also won the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy for the first time and retained the Anagram Records Trophy.



The next two seasons saw a period of consolidation for the 1st Team as they finished 7th and 10th, respectively, in SSML Div 1 (Step 6 on the Non-League pyramid). After three seasons at Hitchin the club moved to share with Stotfold FC. Luke Gregson then took over in 2015, following Grant's resignation, and assisted by Dean Gilbert the team then went on a superb run and ended up just missing out on promotion. The 3rd place finish was the highest placing in their recent history.

The 2017-18 season proved to be momentous as Baldock Town continued to progress and finished second in Div 1 and were duly promoted to the SSML Premier Division. The team continued with its run of excellent form and finished in 5th place in their first season in the SSML Premier Division. The following season Baldock managed to get to 12th position before the season was prematurely ended as Covid 19 started to take hold. Luke Gregson decided to step down at the end of that season and Adam Fisher took over as Manager, assisted by Rob Bates.

Baldock only managed 12 games in the 2020-21 season as Covid-19 pandemic eventually won and the League was abandoned. Rob Bates took over as Manager during the summer of 2021 and started the season with some great Cup performances but failed to turn that into League form. The last couple of seasons have been variable with team development on-going. The Team currently ground share with Arlesey FC and are managed by Dave McAdam.
