



LEVERSTOCK GREEN MATCH REPORT

The Pirates produced a second-half victory against 10-man Leverstock.

Real Bedford gained all three points at McMullen Park after a strong performance against promotion-pushing Leverstock Green. Goals from Josh Setchell and Joey Evans came in between a second yellow for Radu Stefanoaica, leaving Leverstock a man down for the final stages of the game.

Like the reverse fixture just a few weeks prior, the game started with high intensity as both sides fashioned chances in the first half. The best opportunity for the visitors came through a mistake by The Pirates. Dan Petts' lofted ball was met by Eniola Agemoh-Davies, who attempted to knock the ball back to McGregor. However, a miscommunication between the two meant the ball trickled just wide of the empty net, saving Bedford's blushes early on.

Just before the break, Ben Stevens got two shots on goal, forcing a good save out of Liam Gauthier before smashing the follow-up into the side netting.

Second Half

Real Bedford kept a lot of the ball but failed to find that finishing touch—until the hour mark. Under pressure from the Leverstock attack, an excellent pass from McGregor found Joey Evans, who flicked the ball in behind for Josh Setchell to chase. One-on-one, the winger made no mistake, tucking the ball into the bottom left to give The Pirates the lead.

Things would soon turn from bad



to worse for the visitors as their top goal scorer, Radu Stefanoaica, saw two quick yellows inside 10 minutes, forcing him off the pitch for an early shower.

With the numbers advantage now at play, Bedford doubled their lead. Charlie Smith found Ben Stevens in a vacant midfield, giving him ample time to find a through ball to Joey Evans, who slotted home the chance for his 37th goal of the campaign.


Two minutes later, Bedford thought they had found a third. A looped ball over the Leverstock defence found Ben Stevens, who controlled it and met it on the half volley, forcing an acrobatic save out of Gauthier to keep the score at 2-0.

The Pirates then hit the post twice. Firstly, Charlie Smith rattled the woodwork with a 25-yard free-kick before Claston Gordon came close to his first campaign goal after a slaloming run down the wing saw his cross rattle the post late in the half.

However, the damage was done, and The Pirates walked away with the spoils. Real Bedford now travel to Shefford Town & Campton on Tuesday in the League Cup before facing Dunstable Town at McMullen Park on Saturday. Tickets are available here.



SHEFFORD TOWN CAMPTON & MATCH REPORT

Pirates progress in League Cup after penalty shootout win over Shefford

A late goal for the hosts forced the game to penalties, where Tyler McGregor became Bedford's hero, saving two attempts from 12 yards to secure Real Bedford a place in the Semi-Final.

The visitors got on the scoresheet first. Some clever play from Archie Jones released Ben Stevens, who wrapped a shot towards goal. His chance smashed against the woodwork, bouncing up in front of an awaiting Tom Hitchcock, who managed to head the ball into a vacant net for an early lead.

The Pirates maintained possession, but Shefford limited the number of clear-cut chances for the remainder of the half. A blocked shot from Tom Hitchcock and a free-kick attempt from Ben Stevens were not enough to double their lead.

Second Half

Real Bedford continued their dominance into the second half, with more opportunities at goal. Claston Gordon was put through one-on-one with the keeper, who he managed to evade but failed to find the back of the net after a heroic goal-line clearance from Charlie Milton.

Joey Evans was introduced to the game at the hour mark, immediately firing off a warning shot, which Jack Galatis saved in the Shefford net. Eddie Corbit managed to get off a similar chance with the



same outcome, as Galatis smothered the substitute's effort.

In the dying minutes of the game, Shefford produced a late equaliser. Despite having few attacks throughout the 90, they proved clinical in the box. Returning captain Charlie Milton was on hand to bundle the ball into the back of the net as The Pirates failed to clear their lines and maintain their lead, sending the match to penalties.

Luke Knight and Ben Stevens slotted the first two penalties for The Pirates before McGregor made his first save, denying Scott Metcalfe. Joey Evans then hit the post with his effort, but McGregor was on hand to save the following Shefford attempt, maintaining Bedford's advantage.

Lee Watkins dispatched his attempt before Eddie Corbit stepped up to score the decisive penalty, smashing the ball into the bottom left to send Real Bedford into the league cup semi-final.

The Pirates will face Tring Athletic in April in the semi-final but host Dunstable town this weekend at McMullen Park in crucial league action. Tickets are available here.

Dunstable Town FC are now in their 140th year. A former home to George Best, Jeff Astle, Kerry Dixon, and more recently, Peter Kioso, the Club can boast a rich heritage, a proud past and nowadays the honour of being only the 46th club in the UK to be a completely fan owned club run by its fans as a Community Benefit Society (CBS)

The purpose of the Club is no longer just to play football but to be a force for good in our local communities.

The Club is a legal entity & is regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority and supported as a CBS by the Football Supporters' Association.

The Club now operates as a social enterprise. Between Monday and Friday we run seven different groups for people in our local community who want to improve their levels of fitness, increase their social support networks and enjoy a safe space while in recovery from mental ill-health. All our groups are free to join and participate in.

The Club is now in its sixth year of supporting the work of Mind BLMK (Beds, Luton & Milton Keynes) as well as becoming part of the CALM Collective (Campaign Against Living Miserably)

The Club has a specialist Mental Health Advocate who works with local mental health services and charities.

The move to become a CBS was necessary to ensure the Club survived. The financial effects of Covid saw the Club's income halved and the difficult decision taken to fold the U23's Development Team at the end of the 2019 – 20 season.

With no matchday income from the bar or



food sales and no clubhouse to hire out, the Club relies almost totally on gate receipts, sponsorship, fundraising and prize money for its income.

The running of the Club was passed to the fans in 2017 after the wholesale departure of the Board, coaching staff and all but two of the players. A consortium of three local businessmen offered to save the Club, but on condition they would seek voluntary relegation from the Premier Division of the Southern League.

A group of 15 fans took over the running of the Club in order to keep it in the Premier Division of the Southern League and despite successive relegations the model of being a members' run Club proved sufficiently popular for the decision to become a CBS to be backed unanimously by the fans. Fans now have the opportunity to become owners of the Club & buy a single share in the Club and receive exclusive discounts with local traders under the Blue Card scheme.

This model of Fan Ownership ensures that the Club will always stay in the hands of its supporters and cannot be taken over by one single investor determined to ride the non-league financial rollercoaster.

The Club now has over 330 individual owners who elect the Club's Directors and vote on important Club policy decisions.

The Club now has individual owners in many different countries and welcomes supporters of many different clubs who just want to support our community improvement programme, Improving the Lives of Others.
