

MISTAKES COST REAL BE DEFEAT TO WELLINGBOR

It was heartbreak for The Pirates on Valentine's Day as they lost at home to Wellingborough Whitworth under the Tuesday Night Lights. Two costly mistakes gave all three points to the visitors.

Real Bedford fell to a second defeat at home in 2023 in a frustrating 2-0 loss to Wellingborough Whitworth on Valentine's Day. The Pirates failed to increase the lead at the top of the table against a struggling Wellingborough side who managed to find goals either side of the half, in between some gutsy defending from 'the Flourmen'.

It was clear that Bedford would dominate possession throughout the game; however, Real were caught well on the counter inside the first 15 minutes. Kobi Bivens collected the ball around the halfway line before laying it off to the dangerous Connor Bailey, who produced an optimistic effort from range, catching Tyler McGregor off his line and slipping through the hands of the keeper to find the back of the net. The first of two out-of-character mistakes for the young keeper this evening, setting Real Bedford on the back foot and chasing the game.

The league leaders did have a few half chances to level the game. The head of Tom Hitchcock utilised around the penalty area on several occasions, but no ball seemed to find its way towards the target. Kevin Owusu's threaded ball to Hitchcock allowed the striker to get a shot away on the turn, only for it to glance wide of the goal and prove little trouble for young Wellingborough keeper Shackleton. Hitchcock was involved soon after in arguably Bedford's best chance of the half. The ball was spread out wide through Hitchcock to Dan Walker, deputising in a relatively unfamiliar wing-back role, who in turn fired the ball into the area towards an awaiting Jordan Brown, who couldn't get the right touch on the ball to steer it towards goal deflecting it wide of the post. It was proving to be

an agonising first half of football for the McMullen Park faithful.

Real had two calls for penalties dismissed late in the first half, with Jordan Brown and Ben McGrath both tripped inside the area. The referee waved them away as the Pirates headed into the break with a comeback firmly on their agenda.

SECOND HALF

Despite having complete control of possession and playing all the football within Wellingborough's half, Real Bedford failed to make more than one clear-cut chance to even up affairs within the second half. Wellingborough's defensive game plan frustrated Bedford, defending deep and limiting the Pirate's chances of making headway into dangerous areas. The only notable chance fell to Luke Knight from a free kick. The captain swung the ball goalwards from the left, forcing an impeccable save from Shackleton, who managed to tip the ball onto the bar before Wellingborough defenders diffused the situation and cleared their lines.

And if things couldn't get any worse for Bedford, as the clock dipped into the red, Tom Wood played an unopposed backpass towards an awaiting McGregor, but the ball travelled underneath the foot of the keeper, doubling Wellingborough's advantage and giving them all three points in a far from ideal showing from the home side.

Wellingborough saw out the game and kept a clean sheet, only the second team to do it this season.

REAL BEDFORD BEAT LEIC RESERVES 4-1 TO REACH

Real Bedford reached their first cup final after winning convincingly against Leighton Town Reserves. Dan Walker put in a star performance, making two goals and scoring one, with a Tom Hitchcock brace and a customary Jordan Brown goal completing the scoreline.

Real Bedford arrived at Bell Close knowing a win would put them into their first cup final and put the home side under pressure from the whistle and were ahead within two minutes with a wonderfully worked goal. The prolific Jordan Brown gave Tom Hitchcock the opening chance, which he buried confidently into the bottom right-hand corner.

It was complete domination from The Pirates in the opening 25 minutes, with Leighton struggling to create chances, and on 24 minutes, Bedford doubled their lead. Dan Walker broke free and provided a perfect cross for Jordan Brown to slot home.

The Pirates continued to attack the Leighton Box with several balls breaking the backline but without adding to the scoreline. It took until the 36th minute for Leighton to create their first attempt of note, but Bedford maintained their lead.

Bedford continued to pursue a third goal with some great play between Hitchcock, Dan Walker and Andy Sinclair in the middle of the park, opening up chances for Jordan Brown, but he couldn't find the net for his second goal.

SECOND HALF

Leighton came out of the tunnel, determined to get back into the game Leighton Town Reserves 1 - 4 Real Bedford 18th February 2023 Bell Close

and were rewarded immediately with a goal. A very bobbly and awkward pass to Archie Culley was followed by some heavy Leighton pressure, which led to the ball being dispossessed, allowing Leighton to break free and get a goal back.

Another scrappy Leighton attempt came only a few minutes after their first goal, and they were keen to make the game level. However, with only 5 minutes gone in the second half, Bedford restored their two-goal lead. A great ball over the top from James Ducket found Dan Walker, who put another perfect cross into the box for Hitchcock to get his second of the game.

The game began to swing end to end as Leighton looked to get back into the game while The Pirates wanted to put it to bed, but as the half drew on, Bedford increased their dominance.

Rob Sinclair made three changes just after the hour mark, and not long after, Bedford had a three-goal lead. A poorly taken free-kick landed straight at the feet of Dan Walker, who smashed the ball into the back of the net.

Bedford continued to create chances while Leighton pushed for the odd opportunity on the break, but there were no more goals. The game ended a 4-1, with Real advancing to the final of the County Cup.

THE AWAY TEAM

Amersham Town FC was formed in 1890. An inaugural meeting took place at the Crown public house, now a hotel, on 10 October 1890. The Chairman was a local headmaster who was very friendly with W. G. Grace and was, in fact, recommended by that great cricketer.

Among the original rules were no bad language on the pitch, that no player should wear any nails, an annual subscription of 1/6d (or 7.5p) and an agreement that the club colours would be black and white.

The club originally played at

Barn Meadow, down the road from the current ground. Amersham Town moved to Spratleys Meadow in 1920, thanks to the generosity of a local entrepreneur - a Mr Brazil - who founded the famous sausage and pie company bearing his name.

YUMSU

Amersham joined the Hellenic League in 1952. The Clubhouse, a former school room, was erected in 1968 and extended to its current size in 1983. In 1998 the Club secured a ninety nine year lease on Spratleys Meadow and installed new floodlights and a new stand. In 2000, new pitches were provid-



ed across School Lane for the Youth Section.

In 2006/07 the club enjoyed a major refurbishment. The original changing rooms, which were commandeered in the war as an emergency mortuary in the event of an air raid on Amersham, were demolished and modern facilities constructed. The pitch, which had a slope of 11ft 4 inches from touchline to touchline, was levelled and now provides an excellent playing surface and the clubhouse recently has been comprehensively remodelled. Amersham Town was granted Charter Standard

Club status in 2013.


