Real Bedford was looking to bounce back from the disappointing defeat to Langford on Saturday, and from the first whistle, their intentions were clear. New signing Curtis Hartley slotted comfortably into the defence, providing some extra solidity to the backline alongside the returning Tom Wood.

The game's opening chance fell to Jordan Brown, put through via Dan Walker after an excellent first-time ball from Kevin Owusu but Brown's attempt at a tight angle was well saved by Brad Lashley.

Real Bedford's newest signing, Curtis Hartley, sparked the opening goal of the game. His quick-thinking throw-in fell to the feet of Dan Walker, whose cross found Matt Clifford in the box. Playing left-wing tonight, Clifford instinctively nodded the ball to the feet of Jordan Brown, who released a shot on the turn, finding the back of the net in the 13th minute.

Chennecks looked to respond, pouncing on a miscommunication at the back between Tom Wood and Luke Knight, put-

ting George Holman away, but the striker took a heavy touch, inviting McGregor to come out and collect. A warning for Real Bedford.

It wasn't long before Bedford doubled the lead. Dan Walker headed on a long clearance from Tyler McGregor, where Jack Ashton, in the Chenecks defence, lunged at the ball, knocking it back towards the goal. Eddie Corbit managed to collect the ball and break clear of the defence before unleashing a wicked shot beyond the reach of Lashley.

Bedford was not done there and had another chance to extend the lead before half-time. Another long ball caused problems in the Cheneck's defence, rebounding to Kevin Owusu, who looked to add to his long-range tally for the season, but the winger could not get the required height and power behind the ball.

SECOND HALF

The pressure on Chenecks did not cease in the second half as The Pirates contin-



ued to press for another goal against the title challengers. Hartley, continuing his impressive debut, nearly made the third. Picking up the ball on the right wing, he crossed the ball into the box just beyond the reach of Jordan Brown. The ball fell to Clifford at the back post, who unleashed a fierce shot which Lashley saved well.

Chenecks didn't roll over though and their top scorer Dan Holman provided a constant threat. Just before the hour mark, Holman created Chenecks first clear-cut chance with a dangerous run down the left. He cut back inside and found a shot on target, but it lacked power, and the ever-consistent McGregor cleared with his feet.

Bedford continued to dominate possession and found their third goal in the 66th minute. A well-weighted pass from McGrath found Brown clear of the Cheneck's defence, who drove into the box before unleashing a low shot which Lashley could only parry into the feet of the oncoming Eddie Corbit, who collected his brace. 3-0 up with 25 minutes to go, The Pirates were in the driving seat.

Bedford nearly made it four after good interplay between Brown and Corbit again set up Walker. Breaking free down the left, Brown broke into the box and squared the ball to Walker, but his first-time shot was wide of the goal.

Chenecks continued to press and started to unlock the Real defence in the final 10 minutes of the game and found themselves with a consolation goal. Holman, the provider, found space on the left and lofted a perfect cross to the head of replacement striker Wilson who couldn't miss.

Despite the last-minute score, Real Bedford showed their worth throughout the 90 minutes, putting in a solid performance against a strong Chennecks side.

Real Bedford reached the semi-final of the Beds County Cup with a comfortable win against Spartan Division Two side Caddington S&S.

Real Bedford secured a spot in the Bed's County Cup semi-final after winning 13-0 away to Caddington S&S. The conditions presented a challenge to both sets of players as recent weather has been a big challenge for groundskeepers across the country.

The game got off to a flying start for the away side, with Jordan Brown opening the scoring in the 5th minute. The goal came from a header on the goal line, assisted by the returning Tom Hitchcock.

Despite the early goal, Caddington had two opportunities to level the game, but Tyler McGregor made two fantastic saves to deny the home side.

Within a few minutes, it was 2-0,

Hitchcock adding a goal of his own, with Brown providing the assist this time. Brown continued his impressive performance, scoring his second in the 32nd minute and four minutes later completed his hat-trick.

Luke Knight added to Real Bedford's lead with a powerful header in the 37th minute, assisted by a pinpoint cross from Dan Walker. Walker then provided another assist, this time for Tom Wood. The Bedford striker completing four assists in the first half.

Real Bedford headed into the halftime break leading 6-0, with Caddington struggling to contain the attacking threat of the home team.

SECOND HALF

In the second half, Real Bedford continued to dominate the game. Jordan Brown scored his fourth goal in the



27th minute, and Hitchcock added his second in the 61st minute. Dan Walker also got his name on the scoresheet in the 63rd minute, smashing in the rebound after a good save from the Caddington goalkeeper.

Eddie Corbit made it ten with a beautiful 20-yard drive in the 71st minute after great work from Claston Gordon. Jordan Brown then added his fifth goal in the 80th minute, and Rob Ducket scored in the 87th minute, the defender returning to the side after a recent injury.

Brown finished the scoring in the 88th minute with his sixth goal and Bedford's 13th, completing his double hat-trick.

Ahead of several crucial league games, it was important for the league leaders to perform well - a special mention for the commitment and work rate of everyone on the pitch. The players could have taken their foot off the gas in the second half but gave everything for 90 minutes.

A special mention is also needed for both goalkeepers. Despite letting in 13 goals, Caddington's goalkeeper made several impressive saves, which prevented an even higher scoreline and Tyler McGregor, in the Bedford goal, also pulled off two outstanding saves.

Real Bedford returned to league action with a bang. The league leaders put three goals past Eaton Socon on the road to collecting another three points as the title race heats up. Goals from Tom Hitchcock, Luke Knight and Dan Walker giving Bedford the double over Eaton Socon on a cold Tuesday evening.

The game got off to a perfect start for Real Bedford, opening the scoring in the 2nd minute. Matt Clifford played a teasing ball down the flank towards Jordan Brown, who tempted keeper Jeckells off his line. Eaton's shot stopper got caught in no-mans-land while committed to taking on Brown, who managed to find Walker on the by-line, unselfishly the Bedford striker squared the ball to Tom Hitchcock, who placed it in the corner of the empty net on his return to league action.

The travelling fans were hoping for another comfortable victory after Bedford's dominant result in the cup against Caddington. Still, Eaton Socon had other ideas and, despite the early goal, put in a strong half against the league leaders.

Tensions were relatively high from the off, with some full-blooded challenges in the opening few passages of play leading to heated moments off the ball. The referee's whistle became a regular addition to the game, meaning the game struggled to flow.

Despite the early goal, Eaton Socon were keen to get back into the game, forcing Bedford keeper Tyler McGregor to be alert to keep the home side at bay.

Twenty minutes in, Real Bedford had a good chance to extend their lead. Walker again acted as the provider, crossing the ball in from the left towards Matt Clifford around the penalty spot, who headed the ball down to Jordan Brown. Brown's shot, however, was blocked by Eaton defender Hickling, preventing the striker from adding to his goal tally at point-blank range.

Eaton Socon had the last chance before the break and were close to equalising. Striker Stockwell collected the ball on the edge of the area with an ambitious strike on the turn which rattled the crossbar. The home team may have felt that they deserved to be level but Bedford took the slender lead into the half-time break.

SECOND HALF

In a similar fashion to the first period, Real



Bedford came flying out of the blocks, and it was all too much for the Eaton Socon defence, who found themselves two down in the 55th minute. Whilst beating Eaton defender Woodend for pace, Jordan Brown tangled with the defender on the edge of the box, and the referee pointed to the spot. Socon had reason to feel aggrieved as the replay indicated the clash may have been just outside the box. Still, Luke Knight stepped up and calmly tucked the ball into the bottom left corner of the goal, doubling Bedford's advantage.

As the second half progressed, Bedford began to dominate possession, with the odd attack from Socon failing to produce many clear-cut chances, and in the 71st minute, the league leaders wrapped up all three points. Some superb interplay between Dan Walker and James Ducket opened up some space behind the Socon defence. Ducket squared the ball to Walker, who instinctively struck the ball cleanly towards the keepers near post, bagging his first league goal in 5 games to seal the win for the Pirates.

Bedford hunted for another goal and nearly made it four when Walker broke through the Socon high line as he again ran onto a welltimed ball from Kevin Owusu which put him one-on-one with the keeper. Jeckells did well to distract Walker from getting the shot away whilst also blocking Jordan Brown's follow-up shot on the edge of the area.

A Luke Knight free kick set up the penultimate chance, and a floated ball into the box found the head of Tom Wood, who rose above the Eaton defenders but failed to find the target with his header. Then finally, with the clock in the red, a corner from Luke Knight found its way towards Clifford at the back post, whose deflected effort rattled the crossbar.

Socon had a chance to bag themselves a consolation goal but some excellent defending from Bedford's newest recruit, Curtis Harley. The defender lunged to block a close-range shot and give Tyler McGregor a clean sheet.

The three goals proved more than enough as Real Bedford bagged another convincing win to maintain their lead at the top of the table.

THE AWAY TEAM

1968

The football club was formed by employees of the Sileby Engineering company and started off as a Sunday League side playing in local Northampton based leagues

1985

The club branched into Saturday football, competing in the Northampton Town league during which time we on back to back championships as well and success in the Gorrell Barnes trophy

1987

We reached the Northants Junior Cup final losing to Irthlingborough Diamonds reserves. Following entry into the UCL pyramid the club acquired some land in Fernie Fields and the development of facilities to meet UCL standards

1990's

Club flourished under the management of former Cobblers chairman Dick Underwood. Following a sponsorship arrangement the club became known as Vanaid winning the Division One title and adding the Northants FA Junior Cup for the first time, Vanaid also reached the Benevolent Cup final and claimed two Premier Division scalps in the Knockout Cup, but with planning permission for floodlights denied they were unable to

move up to the top flight.

1997

Vanaid won the NFA Junior Cup for a second time.

2000

The club reverted to the Sileby Rangers name, but fortunes on the field took a downward turn as they finished the season next to bottom.

2002

Under manager Nick Verity, Sileby on the Junior Cup again beating Rothwell Corinthians, Sileby repeated the feat in 2003 with the luckless Rothwell Corinthians again missing out in the final, in this season the club also won UCL Division 1 once again

2004

The clubs ongoing campaign to install floodlights finally bore fruit and in the summer the installation was completed along with a new entrance gate being installed on the Talavera Way side of the ground. The following year Sileby won the UCL Division One for the third ime

2010

With an eye to the future the club constructed



an impressive 250 seat stand as well as new terracing

2011

The club management decided to withdraw the Reserve team and Youth team from their respective divisions, with the first team finishing second from bottom in UCL Division 1

2012

The club appointed the previously successful Glenn Botterill as manager and with the assistance of Matthew Green they won the UCL Division one title pipping the extremely ambitious AFC Rushden & Diamonds to the title by two points

2013

The start of the new season saw the club again seeking a new manager and Scott Goodwin took over with just 3 weeks to the start of the season but, after a promising start the club parted company with Scott after only 3 months in charge. Daren Young was appointed as his replacement and after a rocky start he managed to keep he club out of the relegation zone.

The last few years has seen a conveyor belt of managers coming in the space of a few seasons Lee Duffy Andy Hall, Nathan Marsh all came and went. Under the joint management team of Matt Clarke and Paul Brackwell the club almost inevitably found itself relegated to UCL Division One again.

In 2018 the club appointed Mitch Austin assisted by Craig Mander and Jim Freeman in the hope the revive past fortunes but, in mid-February they and the players chose to leave the club leaving the club with no management team and no players. We were grateful to Marc Ansell and Marc Fisher for stepping in at short notice and putting together a team of local players to enable us to complete the season

The team is now under the management of experiences former UCL player Stuart Smeathers assisted by Fazel Koriya and Aaron Clipston and we are all looking forward to the new challenges of the Spartan South Midland League.

Like most clubs Sileby have struggles with the effects of Covid and made little significant progress on the field, however further development of the facilities has resulted in an extended clubhouse with larger changing rooms for both teams and officials as well as a new catering kitchen, the off the field facilities are now on a par with clubs at a much higher level.
