Real Bedford wrapped up an unbeaten August with a comfortable 3 - 0 victory over Letchworth Garden City Eagles under the Tuesday Night Lights at McMullen Park.

Rob Sinclair's men were clinical from set pieces in front of a healthy home crowd to clinch the win and keep their position at the top of Spartan Midland's Division One.

It wasn't to be a walk in the park for Bedford, as demonstrated through the lack of goals and chances for either side in the game's opening quarter. The best opportunity came from Letchworth centre-half Adedoyin Sanni who forced a great save out of young goalkeeper Tyler McGregor, denying the away team the chance to snatch a scrappy opening goal.

It wasn't long after that before the deadlock was broken. A lofted pass from Ryan Coyle put Dan Walker away down the wing, and his cross into the box hit Sanni's hand, which after deliberation from the officials was deemed a penalty. Walker stepped up and smashed the ball into the roof of the net, adding to an already impressive six-goal tally in his first three games.

Five minutes later, Jordan Brown found himself in a prime position to double the lead. An excellent cross from Andy Sinclair fell to Real Bedford's new star striker, who mistimed his shot after an awkward bounce sending it high into Bedfordshire skies.

Moments later, it was Letchworth down the other end, finding some space. Drescanu's delivery was met by the head of their skipper Sam James who failed to keep it down, causing little trouble for McGregor in goal.

Bedford found the net once more on the stroke of halftime. Andy Sinclair's corner kick found



the head of deputising captain Tom Wood who knocked it home and celebrated in style, his goal doubling Real Bedford's advantage as the whistle sounded for the break.

SECOND HALF

In a similar fashion to the Burton game three days previous, Bedford struggled to find good form in the early parts of the second half. Still, the home team battled away, and it wasn't long before Jordan Brown took advantage of miscommunication in the Letchworth defence to unleash a shot that went over the bar.

Letchworth kept Bedford at bay for the next 15 minutes, producing some chances of their own through Shay Kelly and Harry Dollimore but were unable to find the net.

Dan Walker soon produced another opportunity for Bedford with a perfectly weighted ball to Brown. He danced past

Letchworth keeper Nathan Godfrey and squared the ball to Ben McGrath, who, similarly to Brown a few moments earlier, failed to keep it below the bar with the goal gaping.

It took 40 minutes of the second half before Bedford finally found their third, and it was a case of Deja Vu for the away team. This time it was Brown's slaloming run down the wing and consequent cross, which hit the arm of another Letchworth defender, leaving referee Rhys Davies no option but to point to the spot for a second time. Tom Hitchcock stepped up and, identical to Walker, smashed the ball past the Letchworth keeper. The home players mobbed Hitchcock as he opened his account for Real, ending any hope for Letchworth getting back into the game.



While Real Bedford maintained their 100% record, the game was far from perfect and played on a pitch in desperate need of water. Despite having plenty of chances, the team went their longest without scoring a goal. The best came in the form of a long cross from Dan Walker, finding centre-half Tom Wood at the back post, who couldn't connect cleanly with the ball and saw his shot stray off target.

Things picked up just before the break in what was a lacklustre first half. London Tigers caught Bedford on the counter, leaving defenders scrambling, and a heavy challenge from Wood inside the Bedford box left referee Mark Baxter pointing to the spot. The penalty converted by Oyera Lewis gave the home team a narrow lead heading into the halftime break.

SECOND HALF

From the whistle, London Tigers carried on their form from late in the first half, having most of the chances in the opening 10 minutes of the second. Tyler McGregor's several crucial saves and a vital goal-line clearance from James Ducket kept Bedford in the game. It looked like Real Bedford heads were starting to drop for the first time this season.

However, it only needed a spark of Walker magic to reignite the comeback for Rob Sinclair's men, which came just before the hour mark. Once again, off the back of a well-hit set piece, the ball fell to James Ducket on the edge of the penalty area, who whipped a ball towards the towering centre forward. Walker managed to get



a head to it and guide it into the back of the net, albeit momentarily, as the unusual structure of the goal meant the ball ricocheted back into play off a bar behind the goal. Many, including the officials, were confused over the legitimacy of the goal, but after deliberation, the referee pointed to the centre circle. Bedford was back level.

After the equaliser, Bedford took control of the game, with chances coming thick and fast. Rob Ducket, Jack Uttridge and Tom Hitchcock all came close to finding the back of the net, and it felt only a matter of time before Real would take the lead.

After a lengthy stoppage due to an injury to a Tigers player, Bedford finally struck gold. Replacement Kevin Owusu pounced

on a loose ball before finding Walker, who utilised Hitchcock in some lovely one-touch interplay. The ball found its way out wide to new signing Eddie Corbit, whose low-driven cross found an unmarked Dan Walker, who thumped it home from close range, completing the comeback.

The game was far from over; with all the stops in play, the referee added 12 minutes of additional time, which Bedford managed to see out despite good pressure from London Tigers.

Another three points were gained in a scrappy, hard-fought contest against tough opposition.

Raunds Town was founded in 1946. There had been other teams with "Raunds" in the title as long ago as 1896–97, but at a meeting in the town's Temperance Hall in May 1946 a new amalgamated club was formed. The club is nicknamed "The Shopmates" in reference to the local boot and shoe industry, which was largely workshop-based.

In 1950 the Shopmates joined the United Counties League (formerly the Northamptonshire League), playing in the Second Division. They did not set the league on fire, and after switching between the divisions settled in Division One after the former first division was redesignated the Premier Division.

A season in Division Two in 1979–80 seemed to wake them up: after the

division was disbanded at the end of that season, the Shopmates returned to Division One and were promoted as champions in 1982–83. Kiln Park, home of Raunds Town Raunds Town embarked upon an ambitious programme. Having played at Greenhouse Field for two years at the start, they moved to The Berristers for thirty-three seasons and in 1991 they moved to Kiln Park. The stadium adjacent to the A45 was designed to host football at a higher level.

At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were transferred to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League.
